Your Health

The health and safety of our students, faculty and staff is of the utmost importance to everyone at Texas A&M University-Commerce. Every person on campus, including a visitor, is expected to self-monitor for symptoms of possible COVID-19 infection. These symptoms are posted on signage around campus. By being on the campus, you are attesting that you are not experiencing any symptoms, have not received a positive diagnosis of COVID-19, and have not been in the presence of anyone you know to have had COVID-19 in the prior 14 days. If you experience any possible COVID-19 symptoms, please contact your healthcare provider. If you believe you have been exposed to COVID-19, you are expected to contact the person you were visiting on campus within 24 hours of the exposure so we may conduct contact tracing as needed.

Meetings and Events on Campus

We love to show off our beautiful campus, but for the health and safety of all concerned, we are encouraging our students, faculty and staff to hold meetings via telephone or an Internet platform.

All events on campus will be required to follow current State of Texas, System, and local public health guidance related to physical distancing, group size, and health and safety regulations. If an event is scheduled in an indoor venue for more than ten (10) minutes and physical distancing is not possible, face coverings will be required. If additional health and safety requirements are required for a particular event, those requirements will be included in all advertisements for the event and posted at the entrances of the event's venue.

Athletics

We are hopeful to be able to watch our amazing student-athletes in action this Fall. We will follow attendance guidance that may be issued by the State of Texas, the NCAA, the Lone Star Conference, and other public health officials. Face Coverings

Face coverings will be required:

- In all classrooms and labs (*though the faculty member in charge of the class or lab may make exceptions*)
- Any place health services are provided on campus
- On the campus shuttle and other campus transportation
- Where social distancing is not feasible
- Other locations where indicated by signage.

We encourage you to wear a face covering in all other public areas. You may wear any face covering so long as it covers your nose and mouth.
