

### Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act Required Reporting Follow-up Report – July 1, 2020

In accordance with the reporting requirements of Section 18004(e) of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, Texas A&M University-Commerce (A&M-Commerce), an institution receiving funds under this section, is providing the following information:

- 1. A&M-Commerce acknowledges that the University signed and returned to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement. The institution further certifies it will use a minimum of 50% of the funds, or \$3,596,578.00, received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
- 2. A&M-Commerce will receive \$3,596,578.00 from the Department pursuant to the University's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
- 3. The total amount of A&M-Commerce Phase 2 allocation of the Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of July 1, 2020 is \$213,209.00.
- 4. The estimated total number of students at A&M-Commerce eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act during the second phase of allocations are 3,731.
- 5. The total number of students who have received an A&M-Commerce allocation during phase two of the Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is 1,540 as of July 1, 2020.
- 6. The second allocation phase at A&M-Commerce has awarded grants of up to \$213,209.00 under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act. Eligible students were able to apply for grants using a simple online application process. A&M-Commerce made awards using a weighted matrix based on financial aid eligibility and semester credit hours with the allocation of funds to be distributed over four phases: Spring, Summer I, Summer II and Fall 2020. Any leftover money from planned allocations will be used to provide individualized support for students experiencing extended affects from disruptions as a result of the coronavirus. Below is the distribution plan for A&M-Commerce.
  - a. **PHASE 1 OF ALLOCATION**: 40% Emergency Financial Aid Grants for Eligible Students Enrolled in Spring 2020 Semester

- b. **PHASE 2 OF ALLOCATION**: 10% Emergency Financial Aid Grants for Eligible Students Enrolled in Summer I 2020 Semester
- c. **PHASE 3 OF ALLOCATION**: 10% Emergency Financial Aid Grants for Eligible Students Enrolled in Summer II 2020 Semester
- d. **PHASE 4 OF ALLOCATION**: 40% Emergency Financial Aid Grants for Eligible Students Enrolled in Fall 2020 Semester
- e. **EXTENDED SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS:** Individual Emergency Grants
- President Rudin sent instructions concerning A&M-Commerce Phase II Emergency Financial Aid Grants June 2, 2020. To determine if students qualify, they may click on the CARES Act banner at the top of the <u>tamuc.edu</u> home page. Both previous communications from <u>May 5</u> and <u>May 18</u> are linked to this report and may be found on the COVID-19 website.
- 8. On March 23, 2020, A&M-Commerce moved to essential only on-campus personnel. This allowed important services for students to continue. On the same date, all other employees began working remotely and were provided technology as needed to continue job responsibilities from an alternative work location without disruption in pay. A&M-Commerce continues to pay contracted third-party vendors and employees to support student services while following state and local guidelines.
