HOUSING

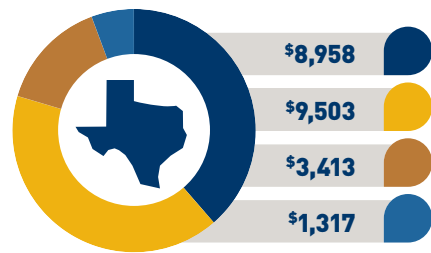
- Choose from **11 residence halls** featuring traditional dorms, suites and apartments. First- and second-year students are required to live on campus for the full university experience!

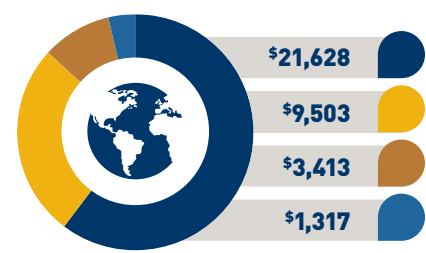

Scholarships are available to help you pay for college! Check out these great opportunities.

Scholarship	Eligibility	Amount
Presidential	Freshman Top 10% Up to 4 years	\$4,000/yr.
Blue & Gold Tier 1	Freshman Approx. 3.8 GPA and near top 20% Up to 4 years	\$2,000/yr.
President's Promise	Freshman Pell eligible and AGI of less than \$50,000 Up to 4 years	Covers full tuition
Blue & Gold Tier 2	Freshman Approx. 3.5 GPA and near top 30% Up to 4 years	\$1,000/yr.
Blue & Gold Tier 3	Freshman Approx. 3.0 GPA and near top 50% Up to 4 years	\$500/yr.

Eligibility for all institutional scholarships is determined at the time of admission. Students are encouraged to apply to the university via Apply Texas by the priority deadline in order to receive full consideration.

Submit your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) through FAFSA.gov beginning October 1 using code **003565** or submit the Texas Application for State Financial Aid (TASFA) through CollegeForAllTexans.com.
