#### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Each applicant must first apply and meet general requirements of the Graduate School.

- 1. Applicants must hold a valid Texas teaching certificate (or) successful scores on the TExES exam (or) have a satisfactory score of the combined verbal and quantitative portions of the GRE.
- 2. Undergraduate grade point average must be 2.75 overall (or) 3.00 on the last 60 hours in the undergraduate program.

## DEGREE PLAN ADVISEMENT

This advising guide is not official. To access your official degree plan go to <u>https://leo.tamuc.edu/</u>, enter your campus ID & password, click myLeo, and click on "*DegreeWorks login for students*." *DegreeWorks (DW) records* your grades on classes completed and requirements yet to be completed. You and your advisor will use *DW* to track your progress and make advisor approved changes in your plan.

### MASTERS COMPREHENSIVE EXAM

Students are required to take and pass a written comprehensive examination during the semester they graduate. Exams are given three times a year; fall, spring, and summer 1. It is important to apply during the very first week of your final semester. ### **GRADUATION APPLICATION**

Because the window to apply for graduation is extremely short, it is important to apply <u>during the first</u> <u>two weeks of the semester you plan to graduate</u>. Then update your degree plan and email it to your advisor who must have it to endorse your application for graduation.

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
