

OVERVIEW

The Masters of Social Work (MSW) program at Texas A&M-Commerce is designed to meet the educational needs of future social workers. The program prepares students for advanced generalist social work practice which will enable them to engage in direct practice, advocacy, supervision, administration, serving as change agents, and demonstrating leadership in various contexts. Upon completion of our MSW program, students should effectively demonstrate competencies such as critical thinking, independent decision-making, and application of evidence-based interventions, promotion of equality and social justice, and evaluation of practice. In order to accommodate working adults, courses are scheduled on various days at various times of the day with evening classes and at different locations.

PROGRAM ADMISSION OPTIONS

Options for admission to the Social Work Program include:

1. <u>Foundation</u> – Students with an undergraduate degree in any field other than Social Work. This is either a full time, two-year program offered over four regular semesters and one summer semester or a part-time program in which students can expect to earn their degree in about four years. Students beginning the program in the fall term can choose the full time program and students beginning in the spring and/or summer term must select the part-time program.

2. <u>Advanced Standing</u> (AGP/Concentration) – Students who have earned a Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) degree from a program accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) within the last six years and have a 3.0 GPA are eligible for expedited admission to the Advanced Standing Program. Students with a BSW older than 6 years, from a CSWE accredited program may apply to the Advanced Standing program, but may be required to take additional course work to update knowledge, skills and abilities as recommended by the Admissions Committee. Full-time students can expect to complete the program in one year.

- Apply online, go to https://www.applytexas.org/adappc/gen/c_start.WBX click on Masters Application, complete and submit. Graduate School Application form completed and \$50.00 paid.
- An official transcript from each college attended submitted to MSWAdmissions@tamuc.edu. Please remember it can take as long as 2-6 weeks for transcripts to be forwarded. If a TAMUC student, provide DegreeWorks or Academic Transcript print out.
- Liberal Arts background (course work in the following areas must have been completed in the undergraduate program or must be taken prior to the student being admitted to the MSW program). A conferred bachelor's degree satisfies this requirement.
- Semester credit hours (sch;) 9 sch Communication classes; 3 sch Math; 6-8 sch Natural Sciences (3-4 sch each class); 3 sch Visual & Performing Arts; 15 sch Socio-Behavioral; 3 sch Humanities; Sciences (includes 6 sch of American History; 6 sch of American Government; 3 sch of other (Philosophy, Sociology, Psychology, Anthropology, etc.) and 3 sch of a Degree Pathway or 2 sch of Physical Ed. /Health and Wellness whichever applies.

GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

A successful applicant must show evidence of the capacity to complete graduate-level work as evidenced by past academic performance. The MSW program will admit students who show the greatest capacity to complete graduate-level work and become effective social work practitioners. Students will not be discriminated against on the basis of race, creed, national origin, age, disability status, sexual orientation or gender. The program is committed to recruiting applicants who represent a diverse population.

The minimum admission requirements for the MSW program are as follows:

- A four-year bachelor's conferred degree from an accredited college/university
- A Liberal Arts background
- A 3.0 cumulative (overall) undergraduate Grade Point Average (GPA) or 3.0 GPA in your last 60 hours of undergraduate work are required. The Graduate Records Examination (GRE) is required if your undergraduate GPA does not meet the above requirements.
- A Summary of Experience: Resume submitted to the School of Social Work (include your mailing address, telephone number, and email address).
- A Professional Narrative Statement must be signed & dated submitted to the School of Social Work (See outline below page 7 of 8 to be used as a guide when writing narrative)
- Three (3) professional references must be completed on our form provided. Reference forms must be signed by the reference (typed signature will NOT be accepted) and must be submitted to department by the person providing the reference.
 References submitted by the applicant/student will NOT be accepted. References submitted from co-workers, family, friends or mentors will NOT be accepted. Only references submitted from current/past instructors or current/past supervisors will be accepted. Supervisor and/or instructor must be noted in Question 1 of Reference Form.
 Request for References using our Reference Form in Admissions Packet submitted to: MSWAdmissions@tamuc.edu or mailed to: School of Social Work, MSW Admissions, HEN 311, P.O. Box 3011, Commerce, TX 75429-3011. Three references must be supervisors and/or instructors.
- Passport photo; Selfie is deemed acceptable if it follows passport style guidelines.

In addition to submitting the required application information, all new students are required to complete a mandatory MSW online orientation before enrolling in classes. The orientation familiarizes new students with our program, faculty, etc. Once you have been admitted to the MSW Program, you will receive a notice by email with information.
